

Los Angeles, CA; August 18, 2017 - ART + PRACTICE (A+P) will present a solo exhibition by artist **Ruben Ochoa** (b. 1974, Oceanside, CA) in Leimert Park, Los Angeles. Curated by César García, Executive and Artistic Director of The Mistake Room, the exhibition will be on view in Leimert Park starting September 9, 2016 through January 27, 2018.


Organized in two parts, *SAMPLED y SURVEYED* proposes a reading of Ochoa's works as articulations of a spatial practice. Bringing together a focused selection of the artist's early and more recent artworks, the exhibition highlights Ochoa's long-standing interest in the processes that bring spaces into being and how these processes then condition the way people inhabit those spaces.

The first part of the exhibition gathers key large-scale works, each produced through a specific construction tactic—extraction, framing, obstruction and reinforcement. Collectively, these works structure and manipulate the way bodies move in space. The second part of the exhibition, envisioned like a drafting room, focuses on the lives and conditions of materials. Bringing together a selection of impressions, drawings, paintings, sculptures, and installations, this part of the exhibition explores how materials themselves are imbued with charged histories as a result of their making, their use, and the economies in which they circulate. This section of the exhibition also attempts to give viewers insights into Ochoa's material abstraction exercises that transform common objects into a charged lexicon of cultural signifiers.

Together, the two sections of the show hope to shed light on less considered aspects of Ochoa's oeuvre while highlighting how his work expands definitions of place, locality, landscape, territory, city, and more broadly, geography—or what geographer Edward W. Soja once called “the spatiality of human life.”

“A+P is proud to announce a solo exhibition and presentation of Ochoa's artworks in Leimert Park—with accompanying Spanish-translated text—as well as organized public programs with artist, curator and author talks. Ochoa's practice gives new light to materials found in the mundane, revealing themselves as complex and thought-provoking sculptural forms. His practice evokes a curiosity in his viewers, helping them consider the endless possibilities of materials and form,” said A+P Executive Director Allan DiCastro. “This exhibition will take place during the run of Pacific Standard Time's *LA/LA: A CELEBRATION BEYOND BORDERS*,” DiCastro further noted.

The opening for *SAMPLED y SURVEYED* will take place at A+P in Leimert Park, on September 9, 2017 from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. at A+P's Exhibition Space, located at 3401 W. 43rd Place, Los Angeles, CA 90008. A walkthrough of the exhibition with the artist and curator is scheduled for September 16, 2017 from 2:00 – 3:30 p.m. at A+P's Exhibition Space. No RSVPs are required and street parking will be available.

ABOUT RUBEN OCHOA

Born in Oceanside, CA in 1974, Ruben Ochoa's practice engages space as both a concept and a material. Often produced with material forms associated with construction, Ochoa's works expose the ideological and broader sociopolitical and economic relationships that facilitate the way spaces we inhabit and move through are assembled.

His work has been the subject of various solo exhibitions, including; *Watching, Waiting, Commiserating*, Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, CA (2016); *MATRIX 169: Cloudless Day*, Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art, Hartford, CT (2014); *Cores and Cutouts*, Locust Projects, Miami, FL (2011); *Building on the Fringes of Tomorrow*, Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, CA (2010); and *Crooked Under the Weight*, Site Santa Fe, Santa Fe, NM (2009), amongst others. Ochoa's work has also been included in a host of group exhibitions, most notably, *Down These Mean Streets*, Smithsonian American Art Museum, Washington D.C. (2017); *99 cents or Less*, Museum of Contemporary Art, Detroit, MI (2017); *Mi Tierra*, Denver Art Museum, Denver, CO (2017); *Routes of Influence*, Perez Art Museum, Miami, FL (2016); *Apparition: Frottages and Rubbings from 1860 to Now*, Hammer Museum, Los Angeles, CA and Menil Collection, Houston, TX (2015); *X-Change*, Nasher Sculpture Center, Dallas, TX (2013); *The Future Generation Art Prize Exhibition*, Venice, Italy (2011); *The Artist's Museum: Los Angeles Artists 1980-2010*, Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles, CA (2010); *Phantom Sighting*, LACMA, Los Angeles, CA (2008); and the 2008 Whitney Biennial, New York, NY, amongst others.

In addition to his exhibitions, Ochoa has completed various public art projects including most notably; *Fwy Wall Extraction* (2006-2007) and *CLASS: C* (2001-2005). Ochoa's work is included in the collections of the Perez Art Museum, the Hammer Museum, LACMA, the MCA San Diego; MOCA; the Phoenix Art Museum; the Smithsonian Museum of Art; the Orange County Museum of Art; and the Whitney Museum of American Art.

He is the recipient of numerous awards including a California Community Foundation Fellowship and a Guggenheim Fellowship. He received his BFA from the Otis College of Art and Design and his MFA from University of California, Irvine. He currently lives and works in Los Angeles, CA.
